

## Ask Buggy: Flu Season is Winding Down, but It's Not Over Yet!

Flu activity in Los Angeles County continues to decline. During week 14 (ending April 9, 2016) 9.4% of respiratory specimens from our sentinel sites tested positive for flu. The overall severity of this season has been slightly milder than past seasons; activity peaked later and continues to linger into spring. The number of deaths where flu was a contributing factor has increased and is now comparable to the number of deaths identified last season.

National flu levels have also declined, yet remain somewhat elevated. During week 14, the number of states widespread activity has decreased from 25 to 18. Several factors likely helped to produce the year's milder season. Foremost, no new widely circulating influenza viruses were identified this season and the vaccine was a good match. Nonetheless, influenza still contributes to considerable levels of morbidity and mortality, especially for vulnerable populations. As of April 12, the CDC reported that 40 children have died from flu complications.


