
STROKE PROGRAM OUTCOMES



Patients with a stroke receive high quality medical and rehabilitation services, allowing them to return home, and stay home, after discharge.


86% of inpatients returned to the community at discharge





96% of inpatients remain in the community 3 months after discharge


Stroke: Remain in the Community at 3 months






Casa Colina provides an average of 133 minutes of therapy per day; 97% individual minutes for persons with Stroke






Stroke: Total Therapy Minutes Per Day

83% of patients receive continued therapy after discharge
